The Grade 7 students from Vancouver Technical School held their second annual Ceremony of Giving and raised \$700 for CHILLD Foundation.

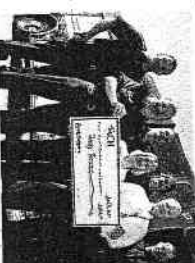

Michael Keenan (10) has joined Anison Young's Vancouver brokerage operation. Most recently he was with CB Richard Ellis.

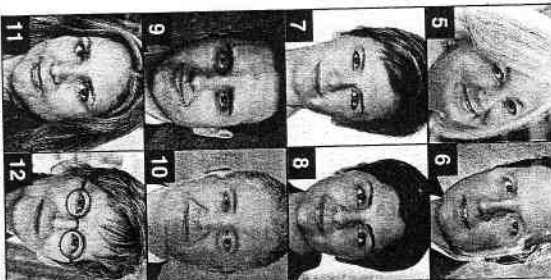
